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EMPHASIZE GOOD MANAGEMENT AND GOOD PLANNING

As documented by the Blue Ribbon Commission in their January, 2006 report on Newton's finances, our city is suffering from a structural deficit that, if not addressed, will result in dramatic reductions in services over the next decade.
